APPLICATION FORM FOR A MODIFICATION TO THE DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

To: Rights of Way Section, Wiltshire Council, Bythesea Road, Trowbridge, Wiltshire, BA14 8JN

Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 modifying the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by:

- a) Upgrading to Restricted Byway the bridleways BBAS2 & CHER20 which run from Point A on the application map (OSGR SU 07931 73105), at the junction between the Byways BBAS1 & BBAS2 and the Bridleway BBAS2, in the Parish of Berwick Bassett CP and proceeds along the Bridleways BBAS2 & CHER20 in an easterly and southerly direction to Point D (OSGR SU 07896 72040) at the junction with the Byways CHER16 & WMON2.

With a width of: approximately 5m

and shown on the map accompanying this application.

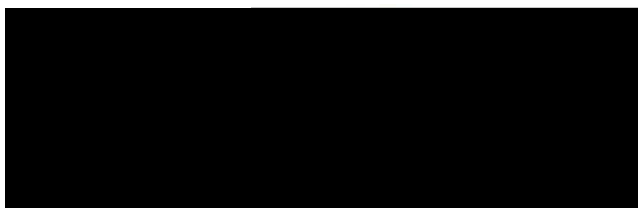

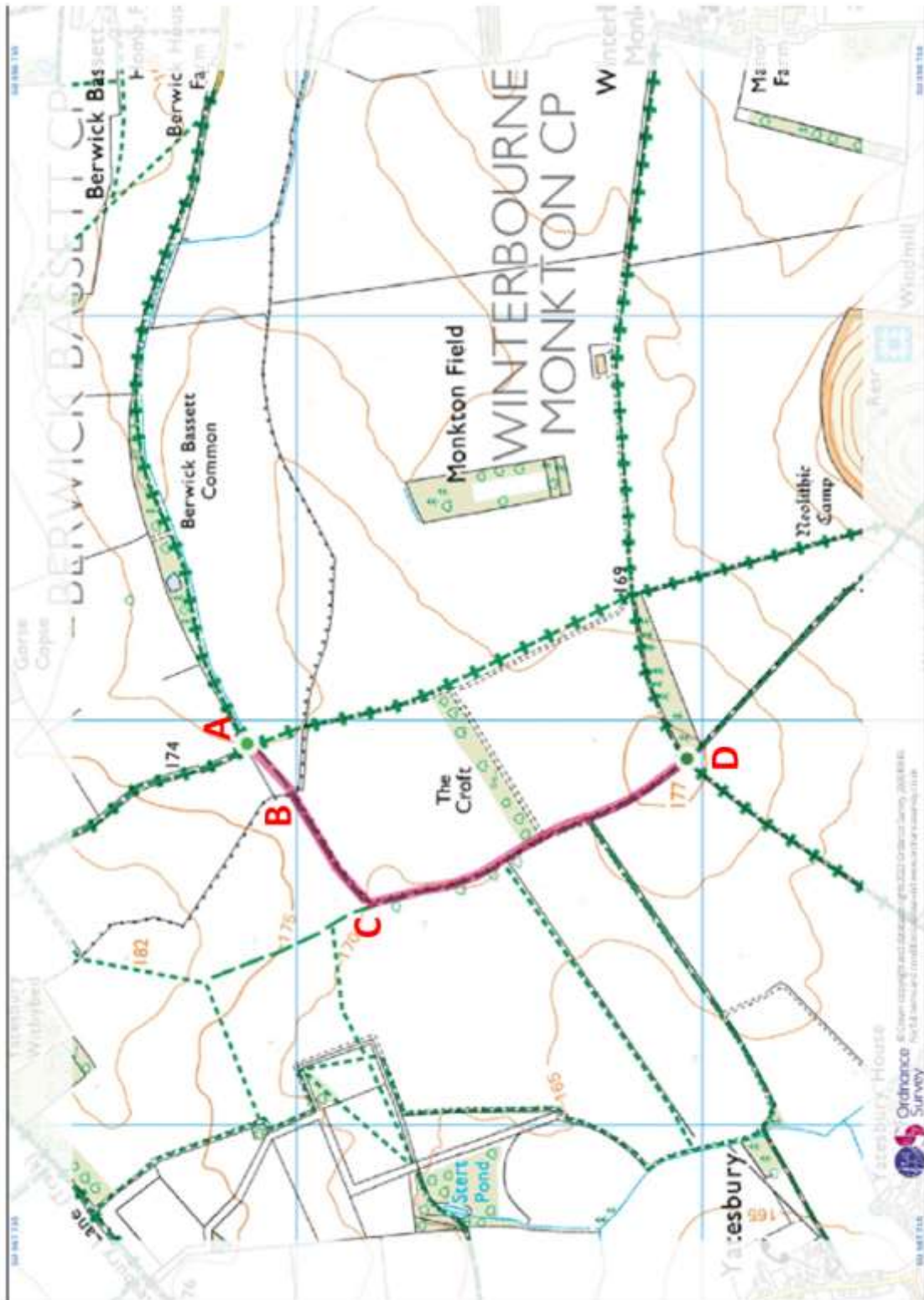
